Charlotte had to learn how to tie various knots to work in the sails and riggings. Using reference materials, learn to identify and tie different kinds of knots. Using a piece of nylon or synthetic rope, create a board on which you demonstrate and label 10 knots from the following list:

Angler knot, barrel knot, Blackwall hitch, bowline, carrick bend, cat's paw, clove hitch, eye splice, figure-eight knot, fisherman's bend, granny knot, half hitch, lark's head, magnus hitch, overhand knot, overhand loop, reef knot, rolling hitch, seizing, sheet bend, slip knot, square knot, stevedore knot, timber hitch, two half hitches, whipping
